I enjoy reading your consumer tips. Can you please run again the tip on using Juicy Fruit to get rid of moles/chipmunks? How about rabbits in the garden, how do you get rid of them?

OK Tess here it is.... It is pretty simple..

Just buy a pack of Juicy Fruit gum. When a mole kicks up a mound of dirt along its under ground tunnel, just carefully move the dirt with a garden spade or other object so you don't touch the dirt. Clean enough dirt away so you can clearly see the tunnel. Then open the gum being careful to not touch the gum with your fingers and just let the whole stick fall in the hole. Then with your small garden spade scoot the gum into the tunnel. Then cover up the tunnel with the dirt. Don't worry about filling in the tunnel with the dirt, The mole will just come along and clean it out then smell the gum and eat it. The gum sticks up its insides and caused it to die of indigestion I have never heard of any trying it that it did not work. But my neighbor who does not like Juicy Fruit personally, used spearmint and the moles just threw the gum back out of the hole. It may take several tries to get them all. Every time you see fresh dirt thrown up from one of their tunnels just repeat the process. After a few packs of gum you won't have any more moles until some more tunnel in from the neighbors. The more neighbors you can get to do it the less likely you will be to have them again because they only usually tunnel about 50 yards at the most.

Now for rabbits and Chip monks. I have never heard of the gum working for either of them. We have squirrels and we just removed any food that they would like to eat and they went away. Any one have a tip on getting rid of chip monks and squirrels for Tess?

Does anyone have any tips they could share with Tess about rabbits? Fencing can be purchased that will keep rabbits out of a garden (that is what I use) but it can be expensive if your garden area is very big. I have spent over \$200 on rabbit/deer proof net fence for my garden. It has a very tight net at the bottom so rabbits or other small animals can not get out or in and larger net towards the top (less expensive that way). I put up 5 net

foot fence then put 3 strings about a foot apart on poles above the netting. The 5 foot fence was less than 1/2 the cost of 8 foot net fence and the string was less than \$10. A deer can jump a 6 foot fence from a standing start. But they think the string is a part of the fence and they wont even try an 8 foot fence unless something is chasing them. So my 8 foot high string fence above the netting keeps them out. Never had a deer try to jump through the 8 foot high string yet. You can also just buy cheep chicken wire to put around a garden to keep small animals out. That is what I did to keep the raccoons out of my strawberries. It is just 4 feet high and was only about \$15 for a 100 foot roll.

Anyone else know of something better than those ideas (like a very noisy dog..ha ha ha)?
